OUR SESSION AT WORK - JANUARY ELAINE OSER ZINGG

At our January Session meeting, a motion was made to discontinue the packaged communion elements and return to the way we celebrated communion before the COVID lockdown with two trays being passed down the rows of congregants by 4 servers. One tray contained individual little pieces of bread, and the other tray held little glasses of grape juice. In the ensuing discussion, some elders thought that we should begin with a transitional change where we would pick up pre-packaged little glasses of grape juice on our way into the sanctuary and take the bread from the trays being passed down the rows of congregants. In the course of our discussion, the issue of who can serve communion by passing the trays according to Presbyterian understanding was raised. After the Session meeting I checked the Presbyterian Book of Order Section W -3.0413 that reads, in part, "Ordinarily ruling elders, deacons, and ministers of the Word and Sacrament serve the bread and cup; the Session may authorize other

church members to do so." This rule does not require the ruling elders and deacons to be actively serving on Session at the time, nor do the ministers of Word and Sacrament have to be actively serving a church at that time. Our church By-Laws do not address this issue.

At our Session and Called Congregation meetings in December, our 2023 church officers were elected. One ruling elder on the Class of 2022, Glenn Rudie, successfully completed his three-year commitment to be Moderator of the Personnel Committee. We appreciate all the time he put into leading that committee and understand that he has agreed to continue as a member when another Ruling Elder becomes Moderator. This will help provide this important committee with continuity. Two newer members of our church were elected to serve on Session. Joyce Holben will be filling a one-year vacancy in the Class of 2023, and Jewell McCliment will serve on the Class of 2025.

OUR SESSION AT WORK - DECEMBER ELAINE OSER ZINGG

Our church held two important ecclesiastical meetings in December: a Called Congregational Meeting on December 18, 2022 and a Session meeting on December 21, 2022. At the first meeting, the Congregation elected a slate of officers for 2023 recruited by the Nominating Committee and approved by Session at its November meeting. Almost all of the people on that list were continuing to hold positions they were holding at that time. There were three changes, and I thought I would provide a little background on these three.

Ruling Elder Glenn Rudie has been serving as Moderator of the Personnel Committee for the last three years as part of the Class of 2022. He has successfully completed his commitment to this position, and did not request permission to do a special 3-year extension of his leadership responsibility. Glenn moved from Chillicothe to Bristol Village in 2017 and volunteered to help our church in various ways before he transferred his membership here from First Presbyterian Church in Chillicothe in 2019. Like all members he will be free to volunteer in various ways in the future.

Joyce Holben moved to Bristol Village and transferred her church membership here from the Newlandsburg Presbyterian Church in Murrysville, Pennsylvania in June of 2020. Joyce was ordained a Ruling Elder on January 16, 1983 by the Clinton United Presbyterian church. She will be filling the one remaining open slot created when Tom Patterson resigned from the Class of 2023. It is not clear what Committee Joyce will be leading.

Jewell McCliment moved to Bristol Village from Harrisburg, Pennsylvania in 2021 and joined our church by Letter of Transfer from the Locust Grove United Church of Christ in York, Pennsylvania. Our church will ordain her a Ruling Elder before she becomes a Moderator of one of our Session's Committees.

Our Annual Congregational meeting will be held January 22, 2023 prior to which a booklet of annual reports will be available to give you a fuller picture of what has been happening here during the last year.

SIGHT & SOUND REPORT

JOHN MIKELSON

My learning curve has been very steep in 2022 and appears that it will continue to be so in 2023.

The most important part of a committee are the PEOPLE. On our committee we have myself, Dave Tallman, and Pat with Betsy and Bobbie (I hope I spelled it right this time) Hall trained enough to step in when necessary.

I wrote an article in the Courier informing the Congregation of the RIDE ALONG PROGRAM and had only two congregants interested in seeing what was involved in presenting SIGHT & SOUND to the church: Doug Holben and alas, Evelyn Baker. Evelyn was going to be our camera operator the Sunday after her death. I feel very strongly that Doug's ride along left him with appreciation for our equipment and the ability to, with guidance, step in and help. The RIDE ALONG PROGRAM is still up and running. If you are interested you will be welcomed with open arms.

I would like to thank the congregation for Your patience with me during your training month of "How to Hold a Microphone." I am so proud of each and every one of You. I have been to other church services and meetings at Bristol Village and watched in horror as people abuse the microphone by not speaking into it and not being heard. You all get a great big ATTABOY!

I have initiated a **LET ME COME SHOW YOU HOW PROGRAM** on Sunday
mornings. After I get the microphones up
and running, the weekly gremlins worked
out of the system, I say a prayer and turn
over the service to Dave and Pat. I then
go to your neighbor's house or maybe
your own house and we push buttons,
move mouses, click on drop down boxes,
etc. etc. etc. and (prayerfully) enhance
your ZOOM Church Service experience.

Since I have taken leadership of this committee I have learned the intimate spaces of the Church: crawl spaces, false ceilings (almost fell through one ceiling but the sheetrock held), behind all the desks/bookshelves/credenzas/etc, and the roofs. We have approximately 1000 feet of new "cat 6" wire run throughout the church with another 200 feet yet to be run.

We now own an incredible sound board, two awesome microphones, ~100 ft of microphone cable, a microphone stand, and a karaoke machine. I will be presenting a request to the Session for two more microphones, another cable and two microphone stands.

SIGHT & SOUND REPORT (continued)

I hope you don't mind, but with much consultation with Pastor Jane & several of our retired ministers, I rearranged the chancel (I think that's what the Rev Dr Doug Holben called it). As You are sitting in your seat the left side of the chancel was crowded: pulpit, piano, organ, trip hazard from

microphone wire. Also, the piano was being played inches from the Pastor's head. With the pulpit on the congregations right, the camera back drop is clean, the trip hazards from the microphone cords are minimized and the handrail is easier to access.

FINANCE REPORT

Our income for December was \$13,358.39 (12-year average is \$15,657). Our expenses for December were \$14,234.18 (12-year average is \$14,472). This leaves us with a loss of \$875.79 for the month. We ended the year at \$10,859.98 in the red for our Operating Budget.

There were no unusual expenses during the month.

According to our detailed financial

analysis, for our Five-Year Plan, we anticipated deficits in each of these five years. A realistic guess was that we would have a deficit this year of between \$5,000 and \$10,000 in our Operating Budget.

In addition to the deficit of \$10,859.98 in our budgeted expenses, we also had a deficit of \$10,047.00 for non-budgeted church/manse expenses for a total \$20,906.98 in 2022 of expenses above income. We have financial resources to cover these deficits.

VOLUNTEERING WITH THE WAVERLY INTERMEDIATE 4-H AFTER SCHOOL PROGRAM






