## OUR SESSION AT WORK ELAINE OSER ZINGG

Last month I reported that the Session had approved auctioning the manse and garage and proceeding to contract Realtor and Auctioneer Thomas G. Brewster to obtain a contract and proceed. Pastor Jane and I met with him on September 4th where we agreed to go with his suggestion that we set the floor amount for the auction at \$175,000, and schedule open houses at the manse for September 24th, 5-7 p.m. and October 6th 1-3 p.m. to be followed by the auction on October 9th at 6:00 p.m. If you subscribe to the local "News Watchman" you probably saw Brewster's ads. The contract Jane signed agrees that the church's costs will be a 5% realtor's fee and up to \$1,000 in advertising fees. At the end of the auction, the purchaser must make a 10% non-refundable deposit The rest of the money will be due at the closing on or before November 22, 2024.

When the church receives the balance of the sale funds, minus its agreed to costs, they will be deposited into the church's checking account. The church's finance committee will then decide how much will stay there to support the ordinary budget and how much will be transferred to the church's Presbyterian Foundation Trust investment. Treasurer Mike Milam will then take the decision in motion form to the next Session meeting for discussion and final vote.

Thirty welcoming bags have been put together for delivery to new B.V. residents to introduce them to the Presbyterian Church and invite them to check us out. They include a postcard invitation to the Tuesday, October 8th Pizza with the social event Pastor Jane will be hosting at 4:00 p.m.

October's Stewardship Emphasis Month will begin the first Sunday of October with World Communion and the Peace and Global Witness Offering. Pledge commitment cards will be included in the October 20th worship bulletin, and pledge cards received will be dedicated on Sunday, November 3rd.

The Bible Study for this year, "Let Justice Roll Down: God's Call to Care for Neighbors and All Creation," calls and challenges us to care for all that God has created.


Our Hostess will be Pat Penrose.

# **COPE CHRISTMAS AND THANKSGIVING**


This year we will sponsor COPE in two ways:

# HEALTH FOR MOTHERS AND NEWBORNS — WORLDWIDE

(PCUSA Giving Catalog)



Lack of access to basic hygiene and health services puts mothers and babies at risk around the world. This gift provides critical water, sanitation and health support to lactating mothers and their infants, offering much -needed assistance at a most vulnerable time of life.

# MORE INFORMATION ON programs supported by the PCUSA Mothers and Newborns projects:

#### NIGERIA – PROJECT OUTPUT:

200 female and aged head of households suffering from disastrous floods were reached with food items (1 carton of noodles, 400g of powdered milk and 1.5 liter of ground oil) plus non-food items (1 mosquito net, 1 blanket, 10 laundry soap and 6 hygiene soaps). These items will assuage the sufferings of those that have been affected by the flood. Most of the women that benefitted are pregnant and lactating women, widows and aged. For the intended period, the beneficiaries will be able to feed and live healthy. They will be protected from the harsh weather conditions and diseases like malaria. This means that monies that would have

been used for medicine will be freed for other beneficial purposes.

#### MADAGASCAR – FJKM PROJECT

This program works with PCUSA mission co-workers in improving water, hygiene and sanitation, agriculture and tree grafting efforts for the farmers and their families. This project will have two expected results:

- The participation of youth and women from marginalized families in the development of their own entrepreneurship in improved.
  - The daily practices and habits of the ecclesial community in nutrition, wash and agriculture practices are improved.


